2024 POSTSEASON GAME NOTES

HOT TAKES:

- The HEAT entered the 2024 Playoffs with an all-time 162-128 (.559) postseason record, the third-highest winning percentage in NBA history, behind only the Lakers (.597) and Celtics (.566).
- Pat Riley has made the playoffs 42 times in his 51-year career, including six as a player, 21 as a coach and 15 as an executive.
- Miami's starting lineup in Game 1 had an average age of 24 years, 264 days old, the third-youngest starting lineup among all Game 1's.
- Tyler Herro dished out 14 assists in Game 2, the second-most in HEAT postseason history (Dwyane Wade, 15 on 5/10/05 vs. WAS).
- Bam Adebayo surpassed Chris Bosh (1,163) in Game 4 for the fourth-most points in HEAT postseason history.

POSTSEASON: The HEAT clinched their 25th playoff berth in franchise history. It also marked their 13th in 16 seasons under Head Coach Erik Spoelstra, the second-most in the NBA over that span (only Boston has more with 15 appearances). Additionally, Miami has not missed the postseason in consecutive seasons under Head Coach Erik Spoelstra, the longest such active streak in the NBA, having last missed the playoffs in consecutive seasons back in 2001-02 & 2002-03.

GETTING DEFENSIVE: Miami allowed just 108.4 points per game this regular season, the third-least in the NBA, and has currently held opponents to under their season scoring averages in their last 29-straight games, doing so by an average of -11.4 points per game over that span. The 29-game streak is the longest in franchise history, and is the third-longest overall in NBA history when including the regular season, play-in and postseason. Below are the longest overall streaks of holding opponents under their season scoring averages in league history.

COACH SPO: Erik Spoelstra has recorded 860 career wins (750 regular season & 110 postseason) with the HEAT, the fourth-most by a head coach with a single franchise in NBA history. Next on the list is Red Auerbach (Celtics) with 885, followed by Jerry Sloan (Jazz) and Gregg Popovich (Spurs). Additionally, Spoelstra has coached over 1,000 career regular season games, becoming just the third coach in NBA history to coach 1,000+ games with only one franchise for his entire career, joining Gregg Popovich (Spurs) and Al Attles (Warriors).

AMONG THE BEST: HEAT Head Coach Erik Spoelstra has recorded a 110-79 (.582) career playoff record, the ninth-highest winning percentage in NBA postseason history. He has recorded the most postseason wins and tied the most postseason series wins in the NBA since taking over the reigns as Miami's head coach in 2008-09. Below are the highest postseason winning percentages in NBA history (min. 100 games) as well as the most playoff wins and the most playoff series wins in the league since Spoelstra became head coach.

HOT FROM DOWNTOWN: The HEAT connected on 23 three-point field goals in Game 2 at BOS, the most in HEAT postseason history, and tied the fourth-most in NBA playoff history. Additionally, Miami's 13 made in the first half were the most in any half in their playoff history and their eight made in the first quarter tied for the most in any postseason quarter. ONE OF THE YOUNGEST: Nikola Jović (20 years, 320 days old) recorded 11 points, nine rebounds, six assists, three steals and one block in Miami's Game 2 win at BOS on 4/24. He joins only Magic Johnson as the youngest players to reach at least each of those minimums in a playoff game in NBA history. Johnson did so twice, on 5/11/80 (20 years, 271 days old) and on 5/16/80 (20 years, 276 days old).

DELON FROM DEEP: Delon Wright shot 6-of-7 from the field, including a perfect 5-of-5 from three-point range, in Game 1 at BOS on 4/21, becoming just the second player in HEAT postseason history to be perfect from downtown with at least five attempts, joining only Mike Miller in the 2013 NBA Finals at SA on 6/11/13. Additionally, Wright connected on all five treys in the fourth quarter, the most in a single quarter in HEAT playoff history while also tying the most for any half (Duncan Robinson – twice, Dwyane Wade – twice and Tim Hardaway on 4/26/96).

SELLING OUT: Miami has currently sold out 599-straight overall games, which includes both the regular season and playoffs (and three play-in games), the fifth-longest sellout streak in NBA history. Additionally, 341 of those 599 overall sellouts have been at over capacity, where fans have purchased Standing Room Only tickets in the Upper 400 Level. 2023-24 REGULAR SEASON GAME NOTES

HOT TAKES:

- The HEAT were a perfect 11-0 this season when Duncan Robinson scored at least 20 points.
- Miami was 13-1 when holding opponents to under 100 points this season.
- The HEAT connected on 1,022 three-point field goals this season, just the second time Miami has hit the 1,000-made mark, joining only their team-best 1,114 made in 2021-22.
- Delon Wright dished out 37 assists with only three turnovers as a member of the HEAT, resulting in a 12.33 assist-to-turnover ratio, this season he recorded 119 assists and only 14 turnovers, a 8.50 season-long assist-to-turnover ratio.
- Bam Adebayo grabbed a new single-season best 737 rebounds, surpassing his previous high of 735 in 2019-20.

.500+: Miami secured their 14th season of at least a .500 record since Erik Spoelstra became head coach 16 years ago in 2008-09. The 14 .500+ seasons over the last 16 years tie Boston for the most in the NBA over that span.

WE HAVE ENOUGH: Miami started 35 different line-ups this season, the most during a single-season in team history. Additionally, 18 different players started at least one game this season, tying the second-most during a single-season in franchise history. WINS: The HEAT recorded 24 road wins this season, marking the seventh time in team history they have recorded at least 24 road wins, including just the second time in the last 10 seasons. Their 24 road wins were the second-most in the Eastern Conference. Additionally, the HEAT recorded 46 total wins this season, surpassing their total from last season (44) where they finished as an eighth seed on their run to winning the Eastern Conference and appearing in the NBA Finals.

DISHING: The HEAT dished out 38 assists on 42 made field goals vs. SAC on 1/31, resulting in a 90.5 percent assist-to-field goals made percentage, the highest in team history. Below are the highest assist-to-field goals made percentages in HEAT history.

1,500: The HEAT recorded their franchise's 1,500th regular season victory on 1/31 vs. SAC, becoming the 10th-fastest team in NBA history to reach their 1,500th win, doing so in their 2,851st game. They surpassed Chicago who claimed their 1,500th victory in game 2,875. Additionally, the Seattle SuperSonics are ninth, having accomplished the feat in 2,786 games.

ROOKIE OF THE MONTH: Jaime Jaquez Jr. earned NBA Eastern Conference Rookie of the Month for October/November and December, becoming just the fifth HEAT rookie to win the award, joining Caron Butler, Michael Beasley, Josh Richardson and Kendrick Nunn and the third to do so multiple times (Butler – 4 & Nunn – 3).

1,000 3FGM: Duncan Robinson connected on the 1,000th three-point field goal of his career on 3/17 at DET, doing so in his 343rd career game, becoming the fastest player in NBA history to connect on their 1,000th trey, surpassing the previous record of 350 games held by Buddy Hield. Robinson previously set the NBA all-time records for the fewest games to 900, 800, 700, 600, 500, 400, 300 and 200. Below are the fewest games to 1,000 made threes in NBA history.



ERIK SPOELSTRA (Portland)

Regular Season Coaching Record: 750-527, completed 16th season

Postseason Coaching Record: 110-79, completed 13th postseason

Erik Spoelstra completed his 16th regular season as head coach of the HEAT and his 29th as a member of the organization. He was elevated to his current position on April 28, 2008. Spoelstra has rewarded the faith that HEAT President Pat Riley showed in him by garnering 13 postseason appearances, nine division titles, six conference championships and guiding the franchise to back-to-back NBA titles in 2012 and 2013. Recognized as one of the game's best coaches, Spoelstra was selected as one of the NBA's 15 Greatest Coaches in NBA History and has earned Coach of the Month honors 10 times, tying the sixth-most in NBA history.



In his previous 15 seasons at the helm, Spoelstra has made his mark on the HEAT record book as the winningest coach in franchise history. Entering this season, he holds team records in wins, winning percentage and games coached. He has also been honored as the NBA's Eastern Conference Coach of the Month a franchise-record nine times. His 13 postseason appearances in his previous 16 seasons tie the second-most over that span in the NBA as Spoelstra has never missed the playoffs in consecutive seasons since becoming head coach.

When Spoelstra first took over the head coaching duties in 2008, he was given the task of improving a young team that had been ravaged by injuries the previous season and had won just 15 games. He then recorded 43 wins in his first season, the most by a first year HEAT coach in team history, while on his way to a postseason berth. Miami became just the second team in NBA history to make the playoffs after winning 15-or-fewer games the previous season. The only other team to do so was the 1968-69 San Diego Rockets, in which HEAT President Pat Riley was a member of.

From 2010-14, Spoelstra took one of the most scrutinized teams and guided them to consecutive NBA Championships, four-straight Conference Championships and four consecutive NBA Finals appearances, becoming just the third franchise in NBA history to make four consecutive NBA Finals appearances, joining the Celtics and Lakers. It also made them just one of 10 franchises in the four major North American sports leagues to make four consecutive trips to the league championship. Individually, Spoelstra became just the fourth head coach in NBA history to lead his team to four-straight Finals appearances joining Red Auerbach, K.C. Jones and Pat Riley. Spoelstra also joined a very elite fraternity when he led the HEAT to a seven-game series win over the San Antonio Spurs in the 2013 NBA Finals. Upon capturing the 2013 NBA Championship he became one of just 13 head coaches in NBA history to have won multiple championships and only the eighth to win a championship in consecutive seasons.

The 2012 championship culminated a compressed 2011-12 season in which Miami went 46-20 and captured its second consecutive Southeast Division title. The regular season was highlighted by a nine-game win streak (Feb. 10-Mar. 1) with each victory a double-digit win. During that streak the HEAT became the first team to win road games on three consecutive nights (Feb. 12-14) since December of 1979 and the first to win each of those contests by double-digits since the 1970-71 season.

Before taking over as the sixth head coach in HEAT history, Spoelstra had served Miami in a number of roles in his first 13 years. He was originally hired as video coordinator and over the years was promoted to assistant coach/video coordinator, assistant coach/advance scout and assistant coach/director of scouting, a title he held during Miami's 2006 NBA Championship, before ascending to head coach. He made a name for himself around the league with his game preparation and superb attention to detail. In his seven seasons as the HEAT's assistant coach/director of scouting, he had the primary role of developing game plans for upcoming opponents. To that end, he coordinated the video staff and advance scouts while overseeing the development of scouting reports and videos.

In 1992, he graduated from the University of Portland with a degree in communications. While attending Portland, Spoelstra was the starting point guard for four years and was named the West Coast Conference Freshman of the Year in 1989. Upon graduating he spent two years as a player/coach for Tus Herten, a team in the professional sports league of Germany.

He has returned to his native Philippines to host clinics and promote education, health and wellness to thousands of at-risk youth through grassroots programs and events. The 9-day program in Manila in the summer of 2011 was the largest NBA FIT event ever hosted in Southeast Asia under the NBA Cares umbrella. In the summer of 2012, Coach Spoelstra expanded his reach into other Southeast Asia nations by conducting coaches clinics and other FIT activities in Singapore.

Raised in Portland, OR, Spoelstra, who was inducted into the Jesuit High School Athletic Hall of Fame in September 2009, is the first Asian/Filipino-American head coach in any of the major North American sports leagues. Spoelstra is the son of Jon Spoelstra, a long-time NBA executive who has guided the Portland Trail Blazers, Denver Nuggets, Buffalo Braves and New Jersey Nets. His grandfather, Watson, was a Detroit Tigers beat writer for many years. In his free time, Spoelstra enjoys spending time with his sons Santiago and Dante and daughter, Ruby, and their dog Rosie.




